Friendship in Action



JINDERA BUSH FIRE BRIGADE

Thank you to everyone who has helped the brigade by ensuring their properties are bush fire ready. The current bush fire season has been the busiest start the Southern Border Team has had for at least the last 20 years.

Since our Bush Fire Danger Period started on the 1st of November 2025, the Southern Border Team have had over **725 incidents** ranging from bushfires, structural fires, motor vehicle accidents and some good intent fire calls, when people see the smoke from many of the large fires in Victoria.

The season still has quite a way to go; Captain Graham asks that everyone remains vigilant to the fire potential for us. While we have had some rain, the forecast weather conditions will dry out any advantage that we may have gained with these falls. If we return to the higher 30 or 40 degree days, with hot winds, we will be back to extremely dangerous fire conditions in and around Jindera.

The **Jindera Brigade** has responded to many of the fire calls in the Southern Border Team area. The busiest day for the brigade was **4 fire call outs within a 24-hour** period. We have had our fire crews responding to fire calls daily for nearly two weeks straight.

Many of the fires we have responded to have been across the local area, helping several of the other Group 4 Brigades who, thankfully, are always ready to assist us



when needed. The **Chainsaw Crew** are extremely busy with many calls to hazardous trees that have resulted from fires. These call-outs, although tiring, also allow our specialist chainsaw crews to hone their skills on dealing with these difficult tree fires.

We have seen many days of **very dry winds** that has resulted in many of the fires in the area spreading quickly and throwing embers ahead of the main fire front, starting spot fires. We ask that you remain vigilant and monitor the fire danger ratings, keep your properties bush fire ready and have your **Family Bushfire Survival Plan** ready to support you in the event of bushfire on, or near, your home and property.



Remember, a fire burning up to **20 kilometres away**, when there are high winds, can drop embers (*see page 25*) on your property, starting **fires** in your **back yard** or in your **gutters**.



Jindera's **new recruits** are progressing through their training and are all starting to attend fires to develop their knowledge and skill levels. This has been a good year for them to be able to put into practice much of what they are learning during this training process.

If you've been thinking about becoming involved, or are willing to join other community minded residents, you can start the process by applying for membership on line at Join the NSW RFS - NSW Rural Fire Service [NSW Rural Fire Service](#) we have many roles that you can help with if you do not want to get on a fire truck.

NSW RURAL FIRE SERVICE

AIDER ASSISTANCE FOR INFIRM, DISABLED AND ELDERLY RESIDENTS

A once-off free service to reduce bush fire hazards.

AIDER services may include:

- Thinning vegetation.
- Removing leaves, sticks and fallen branches.
- Trimming branches from around and overhanging the home.
- Mowing or slashing long grass.
- Cleaning gutters.

An assessment of your property will be completed by NSW Rural Fire Service staff.

Advice will be given about completing your Bush Fire Survival Plan. All works are completed by NSW Rural Fire Service State Mitigation crews.

What is AIDER?

AIDER is a once off FREE service, supporting residents to live safely and confidently in areas where bush fires may start.

The property must be bush fire prone, meaning an area of land that can support a bush fire or is likely to be subject to bush fire attack.

Who is eligible?

Aged residents and residents with disabling conditions who have limited domestic support from family, relatives, friends or other services.

The NSW Rural Fire Service Southern Border Team, and/ or the **Jindera Bushfire Brigade Captain**, may **cancel permits** on any day based on weather conditions. Any cancellation directions must be adhered to fully once issued. Please monitor our local media outlets for any information relating to the issuing of Agricultural Permits to Burn.



It has been a quieter month at the museum during February as school returns and the extremely warm weather continues. We are finally seeing some respite from this weather, which is bringing the travellers back to town and is helping to revive the garden, which was suffering from those extremely hot days. It was also with great disappointment, as a result of this weather, that we decided to cancel our Valentine's Day dinner, which we had been planning for some time. We just did not feel we would be able to ensure our guests comfort on the night if it remained so warm.

Meeting

We had our first general meeting for the year this February, as always, on the second Monday of the month. We want to remind everyone that the

Museum's Annual General Meeting will be held on **9th March**, in the

Supper room of the **School of Arts Hall at 7.30pm**.

We are looking to make some changes to the museum constitution at this meeting, so we would encourage interested members and friends to attend.

The February Meeting was very well attended, and the business of the last 2 months and the upcoming AGM were the predominant focus of the evening.



The following Saturday, the monthly working bee accomplished several dusting, cleaning and maintenance issues, all ongoing jobs on this large site.

Men's Shed

The Men's Shed group, as many are aware, meet on a **Wednesday morning** in the **Tim Fischer Working Machines Shed** which is in the Museum complex. Access on a Wednesday morning is via the Dight Street entrance, opposite the entrance to the recreation ground. Members meet from about **8.30am** and have a range of projects and activities on the go every week. They also look to help out with repairs and maintenance items for the museum, which is greatly appreciated. New signage will be erected shortly, highlighting the Men's Shed.




Mural

The wonderful mural depicting the early period of the town's history, is nearly complete. It has been amazing to watch the scenes unfold and the detail emerge, along with the colour and vibrancy. New Machinery Shed

Work in the new shed is unfolding as preparations are being made for the arrival of a new project which will be announced shortly. Additional displays are being added to the wall of the shed, with timber panelling being added to the inside of the shed to allow specific exhibitions. The Men's shed participants have been very busy installing the panelling and preparing for the first of these exhibits. The iconic **Granite Hill chaff cutter** has now been parked, along with a steam traction engine also from Granite Hill. This chaff cutter is a very special part of the **local farming history**, as it was utilised around the district for the chaff making conducted on many farms. Stalks from the cereal crops grown were fed into the cutter and cut into short lengths. These could be fed like this or mixed with molasses or crushed grain to increase its nutritional value. Chaff was a vital feed for livestock, and having an expert team that could manage this process was very valuable.



Come and join a group of locals who are interested in our community and its people, and who would like to help improve the facilities our community offers to both visitors and residents alike.

A few of the issues we are discussing at present are:

Village Shopping Centre—the Forum will attempt to chase the repair of the massive “hole” in the carpark and repainting of traffic arrows - Council has already attempted to contact the owner with no result.

15-Minute parking in front of the Hub—This will be addressed in the April Forum meeting in discussions about the main street in general.

Dust at current residential land developments—contractors are trying to keep the areas watered, but previous dry weather and winds have not facilitated this-hopefully with some rain now this will improve.

Adventure Playground and associated parking area—this area cannot be completed until the remaining decrepit playground frontage trees can be removed which has been stalled by community objection to their removal—maybe we need another petition to change this anomaly back. Replacement trees could have been planted quite some time ago and the carpark sealed and constructed as budgeted.

Postcode issue—the Forum will try again to canvas for reallocation of postcodes for the multiple areas covered by 2642—this is impacting on insurance costs at present due to fires in some areas and in previous years due to flooding.

Alternative route for traffic through Jindera—should Jindera be considering a bypass road, in future planning, to take the through traffic moving down the main street?

April Forum meeting—Greg Blackie (Greater Hume Council Director-Engineering) will be speaking to the meeting about future works around Jindera. If anyone has any issues they would like to raise with Greg in relation to works and developments please advise the Forum by **April 14** so we can forward the issue to Greg for addressing at the meeting. A reminder for submissions will be placed in the April Jindera News.

BEYOND THE BARGAINS!

REPAIR ♡ RE-USE ← RECYCLE ♻️

Jindera Rural Care Link Op Shop is a bustling hub of bargains, chatter and connection. Operating for the past 30 years across only 2 locations in Jindera the tiny but mighty Op Shop is run by a dedicated team of volunteers. Each day sees the team organising and sorting through up to one hundred kilograms of donations. Clothing, bric-a-brac, kids toys and kitchenware are donated daily along with larger items like bicycles, furniture, sculptures and crafting supplies. Every item that is donated is personally sorted, screened and assessed for sale.



But what happens to the donations that cannot be re-homed? It is well known that Op Shops are often inundated with unsuitable items that would in other circumstances go to landfill. Damaged, soiled or down-right inappropriate items find their way to the donation bin. Fortunately, one of the roles that Op Shops play, within our communities is also that of recycling.



It's not the easiest of jobs. Sorting through items unwanted, discovering the damaged, soiled and unusable and then deciding what the most responsible method of disposal may be. Luckily, the Rural Care Link Op Shop has numerous avenues to ensure that **95% of items** not appropriate for reuse are **kept out of landfill**.



A thorough review of the Op Shop's waste management was conducted in late 2025. After consultation with various suppliers Rural Care Link was able to reduce their waste management costs by over \$300 per month.

How? Utilising our very own **local recycling services**. All cardboard, paper, hard plastics and other recyclable products are placed in yellow bins for collection or are taken just 3 minutes down the road to the **Jindera Transfer Station**. All **recycling is FREE to drop off!** While we have access to this fantastic free service there are dozens of other items the Op Shop ensures are recycled that normally would not be.

Textiles and excess clothing are a major source of waste in Op Shops - poor condition, soiled or damaged clothing is always sorted to ensure customers have access to only the best quality donated items. Those that don't make the cut are hand sorted by volunteers - buttons are removed to avoid contamination and are often collected or used by others, some are cut down into usable rags while some can be washed and repaired by volunteers who have the skills and time. Clothing that cannot be utilised in this way is placed into



our **Passover Bins** and collected by **Southern Cross Recycling Group (SCRG)**. SCRG employs people nationwide who collect the overflow of textiles from op shops, sorts them, and then uses a network of organisations and enterprise businesses to ensure the items are **kept out of the landfill**.



SCRG works with **Australian Disability Enterprises (ADEs)** to provide employment opportunities for people living with disabilities and youth at risk while also supporting other charities and their work within the social sphere such as **The Smith Family, Lifeline** and **Save The Children**. Textiles are also transformed into **eco-bricks** or recycled into new clothing.

Shoes are another item that are notoriously difficult to recycle however thanks to the **Treadlightly Program**, all enclosed shoes that are not suitable to sell can be recycled! Shoes that the Op Shop cannot sell are collected and sorted with those not making the grade then going into our Passover Bins and collected by SCRG who utilises this program to ensure shoes stay out of landfill.

All electrical items, wood, white goods and metal are all separated and disposed of responsibly at our local Transfer Station where they are recycled wherever possible.



Our local Op Shops are amazing places, run by volunteers, helping the community and providing a valuable recycling service. You can help the local Rural Care Link Op Shop to continue their amazing work by considering a few key points before you donate your unwanted items:

* **Have you ended up with a whole trailer load of unwanted items?** Big items like furniture? Have a Garage Sale!! Everyone loves a bargain and why not top up the piggy bank at the same time. At times your local Op Shop won't have room to accept huge donations - both to store or display. Consider a garage sale with your neighbours to clear out the shed. **For Jindera residents the Jindera Community Garage Sale (see front page) is coming up on Sunday the 19th April! Great chance to clean up!**

* **Do you have a wardrobe full of clothes that you need to sort through?** Consider washing and drying the clothes BEFORE you pack them up for donation. You might find they can be repaired, or maybe they're back in fashion! Ensuring the items you donate are in good condition makes Op Shop volunteers' jobs so much easier when it comes to assessing them for sale. It also means items that otherwise may have been considered unsuitable due to soiling or damage can now be given a new home!



* **Would you give the item to a friend as a gift?** If you wouldn't pass the item onto a friend, it's unlikely that an Op Shop will be able to find it a new home either. Consider repairing, upcycling or recycling the item if you wouldn't hand it over to a mate.

As we begin the 2026 preschool year, children have been warmly settling into their programs, building new relationships and re-establishing familiar routines. The focus of these first weeks has been creating a calm, predictable environment where every child feels safe, secure and ready to learn. We can't wait to see where our learning journey takes us in 2026.

An important part of this term has been practising our emergency evacuation procedures. Through guided practice, children are learning what to do, where to go and how to respond calmly in the event of a fire or emergency. These experiences help build confidence, reduce anxiety and ensure that safety routines are familiar and understood.

Learning has already begun to deepen through intentional early literacy, numeracy and inquiry experiences, thoughtfully documented in our co-constructed floorbook. Through drawing, mark making and shared storytelling, children are strengthening early literacy foundations while developing identity, agency and a sense of belonging within our learning community. Numeracy learning unfolds authentically as children count details in their work, compare size and quantity, explore patterns and use mathematical language in meaningful contexts.

Creative exploration continues to flourish, with painting and clay experiences supporting fine motor development, persistence and creative risk taking. Inquiry learning remains strongly child led, with children exploring questions about the natural world and engaging in shared research and collaborative thinking.

This term we are also excited to introduce Kindness Kitchen, a monthly cooking experience where children bake for members of our wider community. Through preparing food for others, children practise compassion in action while developing early literacy and numeracy skills through following recipes, measuring and sequencing. These meaningful experiences strengthen social connections and reinforce our commitment to nurturing confident, capable and caring learners.

Proposed Holbrook to Corowa Rail Trail

The **disused rail line** from Holbrook to Corowa is approximately 100 kms long. It goes through Morven, Culcairn, Walla Walla, Burrumbuttock and Brocklesby in the Greater Hume Council area as well as towns in Federation Council. Starting in Holbrook, visitors could access the rail trail from the Hume Hwy. From **Jindera**, it is even closer.



A committee has been set up with representatives of each town along the route with a proposal to transform the disused rail line into a recreational rail trail for **cyclists and pedestrians** which **excludes motorised transport**. Many of the points outlined in last year's 10-year Greater Hume Council Strategic Plan would be achieved with a rail trail. **Currently, there is a lack of safe cycling infrastructure in this region.** The nearest rail trail is the High Country Rail Trail from Wodonga to Shelley in Victoria.

Advantages of rail trails include providing a safe place for locals to exercise, financial boost through tourism spending, and improved access for emergency services during bushfire. In its current state, this rail corridor is overgrown with weeds and trees which pose a fire risk and are choking out native vegetation.



Rail trails have been proven to attract many visitors which means overnight accommodation, food and drinks as well as visitors spending money on tourist attractions. With a proposed sealed surface, it is suitable for all kinds of bikes as well as mobility scooters, prams, strollers, tricycles and so on.

Sporting clubs and schools use rail trails for fitness training, sport lessons and cross-country carnivals while community groups use rail trails as fundraisers to host fun runs and bike races. Birdwatchers also use rail trails to observe birds in a safe and quiet location. Therefore, everyone can reap the benefits of a rail trail.



The majority of funding will come from grants through State and federal Government as well as regional development grants, not local councils. Therefore, council rates are not affected. Community consultation would occur before construction begins if this proposal was to go ahead. For more info contact: c2crailtrail@gmail.com

The result will be a vibrant green area that enhances the beauty of the gardens and provides a welcoming space for visitors to relax and connect.


This great revitalisation project would not have been possible without the generous support of local organisations.

The NSW Government is bringing back its highly successful Washing Machine Exchange Program, helping more pensioners, veterans, and social housing tenants to cut their water and power bills.

Delivered in partnership with The Good Guys Commercial, the discounted price includes delivery to any part of NSW, professional installation, removal and recycling of the old top load washing machine, and a two-year warranty.



The program is helping households cut their bills by up to \$300 a year and save hundreds of millions of litres of water.

Now in its second year, the program is offering 6,500 new, energy-efficient 8kg front loaders to eligible concession card holders for a heavily discounted \$250 when they trade in their old top-loader.

The first round of the \$11 million program attracted overwhelming demand, with more than 5,000 machines snapped up within days.

The NSW Government's Water Efficiency Program is leading efforts to reduce water use across the state, with water savings from this initiative expected to exceed 230 million litres by the end of this round. Drought Announcement Highlights Urgent Need for Practical, Timely Support

Greater Hume Council has welcomed the NSW Minns Labor Government's expanded drought package, while warning that urgent, practical assistance must reach farmers without delay. Mayor Lea Parker said the drought is no longer just a farming issue — it is a whole-of-community crisis.

“Over 33 per cent of our Shire's GDP comes from agriculture. When farmers are under pressure, the effects ripple through every local business, school and household” Mayor Parker said. *“The groundwater has dried up. Many farmers have already purchased several loads of water for personal use; however, carting water for stock is not a viable long-term option.”*

Long-range forecasts are predicting even drier conditions ahead, with climate models indicating a potential shift toward El Niño, which is typically associated with hotter and drier weather across eastern Australia. This outlook is adding to community concern. Mayor Parker also urged residents to look out for one another during this difficult period. *“These are incredibly challenging times for many families across our region. Please check in on your neighbours, support local businesses where you can, and look out for one another. Community strength and kindness matter now more than ever.”*





Above all, please look out for one another. Stay connected, reach out if you need support, and don't hesitate to ask for help.








